Can Yeğinsu is a London-based international lawyer, author and lecturer. In Winter Term 2016, Can lectured on international arbitration and investment treaty arbitration at Harvard Law School. He is currently Vice Chairman of the British Turkish Lawyers' Association and a member of the International Bar Association, the London Court of International Arbitration, ICC, COMBAR, ASA, ALBA and Lawyers for Liberty.
